Parking a Motor Vehicle on a Local Government Controlled Area

Information for Motorists

Council officers patrol various locations across the region to regulate parking in accordance with State and Local Laws. Infringements may be issued where a person is parked in a local government controlled area without approval from Council or a sign permitting parking in the area.

Why does council regulate parking in a park?

Open spaces, including parks and nature reserves, within our community are designed for use by the public. Vehicles driving and parking in these areas can cause obvious and unseen impacts on the area and the infrastructure used to maintain these spaces. For the safety of the public, the driving of vehicles should be restricted to roads and road related areas.

What is the law?

A person must not drive, ride or park a motor vehicle on any part of a local government controlled area that is not a motor vehicle access area without prior approval. If you need access for an event, or to access your property, or undertake work, you must make an application to Council for approval before driving or parking in the local government controlled area.
