Parking on a Nature Strip, Footpath or a Parkland

Information for Motorists

It is illegal for a driver to park their vehicle on a nature strip, footpath or parkland anywhere in Noosa Shire. Parking is regulated under the State and Local Laws.

Legal Parking

A driver who parks on the side of a road must position their vehicle as near as practicable, to the far-left side of the road. The driver must also ensure:

- The vehicle is facing in the direction of travel.
- The driver must position the vehicle, so the vehicle does not unreasonably obstruct the path of other vehicles or pedestrians.
- The driver must allow 3 metres of clearance between any continuous dividing line or a dividing strip.
- If there is no continuous dividing line or a dividing strip, the driver must allow 3 metres of clearance between either the edge of the road or another parked vehicle.

What if I park my vehicle incorrectly?

Council Parking Officers conduct regular patrols across the Shire to ensure the safety of cyclists, motorists, and pedestrians. If you are found breaching parking regulations, you may be issued an infringement. Any person who receives an infringement has the right to appeal the infringement. Evidence must be supplied to support any appeal.
