

Osprey Ave Footpath Upgrade, Peregrin Beach

Project summary

Noosa Council is upgrading the pedestrian pathway along Osprey Avenue, Peregrin Beach to provide a safer and more accessible, pathway for the community. The project involves renewing and widening the existing pathway over approximately 450 metres to better accommodate pedestrians, cyclists, and other users.

This upgrade is part of Council's ongoing commitment to improving active transport infrastructure and enhancing community safety.

Scope of work

The works include:

- Removal of the existing narrow and deteriorated pathway (approximately 900 mm wide).
- Construction of a new, wider concrete pathway designed for safety, ease of use, and accessibility for all users.
- Landscaping and reinstatement of any areas disturbed during construction.

Timing

Construction will generally occur **Monday to Friday, 6:30am – 4:30pm**.

Works are scheduled to start **Monday, 20 April 2026** and are expected to be **completed by mid-May 2026**, weather permitting.

Community impact

During construction:

- There will be temporary pathway closures along Osprey Avenue.
- Alternative routes for pedestrians will be in place.
- Residents may notice minor noise, and construction vehicle movements during the work.

Council and the contractor will work closely to manage impacts, minimise disruption, and maintain safe access wherever possible.

Traffic Impacts

- The northbound lane will be closed to traffic during weekdays and reopened in both direction for weekends.
- Traffic controllers and signage will assist road users to navigate around the single lane closure.
- Emergency access will be maintained at all times.

Noise Impacts

Some construction noise is expected. The project team will work to minimise disruption and thanks the community for their patience during this time.
